Highlights

ECB consults on its guide to internal models. EBA issues QIS templates for Basel III impact assessment. ECB issues opinion on cross-border payments. ESMA issues opinion on amendments to SFTR. BdE consults on changes to information for calculating DGS contributions. Finally US Agencies extend deadline for comments on Volcker Rule amendments.

EUROPE

• ECB launches public consultation on its guide to internal models

<u>Includes</u> the credit risk, market risk and counterparty credit risk chapters of its guide to internal models. It is aimed at ensuring a consistent understanding and implementation of the legal framework. Deadline: 7 Nov.

EBA publishes QIS templates for the Basel III impact assessment

Two sets of <u>templates</u> have been issued: full and reduced, for large and medium/small banks respectively. These templates will be used in the impact assessment for the finalisation of Basel III.

ESAs publish report on automation in financial advice

Report shows slow growth of <u>automation in financial advice</u> with limited number of firms and customers involved. No immediate action is deemed necessary given that identified risks have not materialised.

• ECB issues opinion on proposal regarding cross-border payments

It <u>suggests</u> amending the proposed regulation as regards its scope and the possibility of a merchant's providing the currency conversion service independently. It clarifies some definitions and reduces some transitional periods.

ESMA issues opinion on proposed amendments to SFTR technical standards

In response to the European Commission's proposed amendments, it publishes an <u>opinion</u> declining to amend the draft technical standards on reporting under the Securities Financing Transactions Regulation (SFTR).

• ESMA publishes Trends, Risks, and Vulnerability report (TRV) and risk dashboard

<u>Both</u> reports show that EU securities markets <u>remain stable</u> but with high levels of risk for most categories. Volatility risk has increased for securities markets, infrastructure and investors.

EIOPA publishes monthly technical information

i) Relevant <u>risk free rate term</u> structures for the month of August (but information on Danish krone suspended due to technical errors). ii) Updates the symmetric adjustment of the <u>equity capital charge</u> with end-August data.

SPAIN

• BdE consults on changes in information for calculating contributions to the Deposit Guarantee Scheme

The public <u>consultation</u> seeks to receive opinions on the changes in information on depositors comprised in the proposed amendment to Annex II of Circular 8/2015. Deadline: 10 Sep

UNITED KINGDOM

PRA issues policy statement on its approach to enforcement

It sets out the final <u>procedures</u> for the Enforcement Decision Making Committee and amends the PRA's approach to enforcement.

• UK Treasury issues Statutory Instruments for payment services, electronic money and SEPA regulation

In order to <u>ensure</u> the smooth functioning of the regime following Brexit, it amends retained EU law on payment services and e-money (including the Single Euro Payments Area regulation).

UNITED STATES

Agencies extend comment period for amendments to the Volcker Rule

The five agencies with power over the rule agreed to <u>extend</u> the comment period for the proposed changes in the Volcker Rule. New deadline: 17 Oct.

• FDIC issues list of banks examined for the Community Reinvestment Act

List of state <u>non-member</u> banks recently evaluated for compliance with the CRA. These banks were assessed in June.

OCC issues updated booklet regarding real estate

Updated to include some <u>accounting</u> changes. The booklet provides guidance to examiners regarding banks' acquisitions, reporting, management and disposal of 'other real estate owned' (OREO).
