

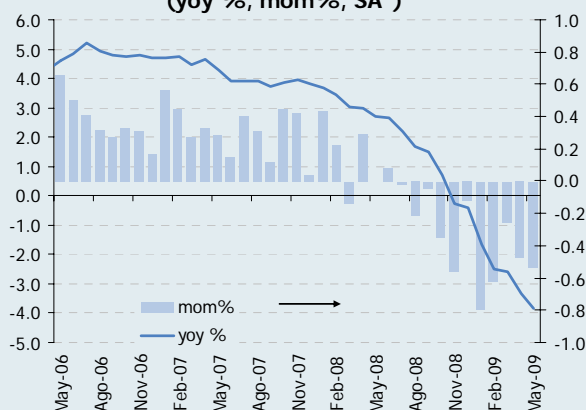

Flu epidemic interrupted period of lowest levels of decline in formal employment

- In May formal employment in the private sector fell by 75 thousand period, -0.54% lower in monthly terms in the formal sector, within the forecast range but with a negative trend
- The health emergency took its toll and stopped the change in trend towards a lower level of decline that was recorded in previous months on the formal job market. The monthly drop, 0.5% in seasonally-adjusted terms, is the worst rate since last February.
- The reduction in formal employment was closely linked to the tourism sector and the main companies hit by the flu outbreak:
 - Out of the 75 thousand jobs lost during the month, almost 30 thousand were in tourism-related activities (40% of the total). These figures do not include informal employment in this activity
 - The states that recorded the biggest monthly falls were Quintana Roo, Guerrero, BCS and Nayarit, with -8.1%, -2.3%, -1.9% and -1.6% respectively. In absolute terms, Mexico City lost eight thousand jobs during the month, equivalent to -0.3%.
- Although in annual terms the manufacturing sector is feeling the most job losses last month services accounted for most of the change (-45 thousand).
- **Outlook:** in the short term the job market will continue to experience the negative impact of lower demand due to the flu outbreak, especially in tourism-related activities. However, the most recent data from some subsectors such as hotels display a gradual recovery in occupancy levels, which points to a relatively quick absorption of the negative effects of the epidemic on the job market.
