EUROPE

• The Italian Ministry of Finance publishes agreement on bad bank

This allows the Italian banking sector to dispose of its doubtful loans. The EC confirms that this does not infringe the state aid regulations.

. ESAs send letter to the EC on cross-selling of financial products in the EU

Expresses concerns on the regulatory inconsistencies, and requests evaluation and measures to achieve consistency between the banking, insurance and investment sectors.

• EC reports on eligible capital to the European Parliament and Council

It considers it appropriate to maintain the current definition, which limits the amount of Tier 2 capital to include in terms of complying with the CRR large exposure limits.

EP adopts report on stocktaking and challenges in the regulation of financial services

After the plenary vote of 19 Jan, the EP adopts the text of legislative progress and challenges regarding capital markets union.

EBA launches impact assessment of IFRS 9

This is to help the EBA understand the impact of the application of the new standard on banks' regulatory own funds and their interaction with other prudential requirements.

• ECB publishes opinion on the reform of the Greek Deposit Guarantee Scheme

This opinion includes observations on the national implementation of the European Directive on deposit guarantees.

EIOPA publishes results of the first EU stress test on the occupational pension fund sector

These demonstrate that the IORPs are relatively more resilient to increases in longevity than to market adverse scenarios.

EIOPA publishes opinion on calculation methods for group solvency



Asks for clarifications on issues such as the determination of the basis for the level used in the eligibility of own funds in the use of combined methods.

ESMA on the methodologies of credit rating agencies (CRAs)

Open hearing on the validation and review of five categories of indicators identified by EMSA to evaluate the methodologies used by the CRAs.

• Belgian Central Bank notifies ESRB on counter-cyclical buffer (CCB)

Shortens the transition period and recognises the shorter transition periods of other jurisdictions, recalling that the CCB came into force on 1 Jan.

· ESMA signs memoranda of understanding with authorities in Mexico and South Africa

On complying and recognising the conditions of covered CCPs in Mexico and South Africa respectively.

SPAIN

Bank of Spain analyses the most important financial regulation issues in 4Q15

Highlights include: contributions to the Single Resolution Fund, developments in recovery and resolution of banking entities and a Directive on payment services.

· Bank of Spain consults on modification to accounting circular

Consultation on modifications to Annex IX, on analysis and coverage of risks, to adapt it to the latest banking regulations. Deadline: 19 Feb.

· CNMV consults on information pamphlet on tariffs and content of interest-rate contracts

In relation to the Draft Circular with the objective of improving investor understanding thanks to more transparency and comparability. Deadline: 11 Feb.

· Official State Gazette publishes new notification models

CNMV Circular on significant shareholdings, treasury stock transactions and other. Effective date: 28 Jan.

UNITED STATES

Fed on stress tests and the comprehensive capital analysis and review (CCAR) for 2016

Releases supervisory scenarios for CCAR and Dodd-Frank Act stress test exercises, along with instructions





addressed to firms participating in 2016 exercise.

• FDIC consults on deposit guarantees of small banks

Review of the contributions made by banks with assets of less than USD10,000 mn. Deadline: 30 days after publication in the Federal Register.
