## Financial Regulation: Weekly Update. 2 February 2018

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GLOBAL

• IOSCO issues recommendations for investment funds management

They seek to improve <u>liquidity risk</u> management practices for open-ended collective investment schemes. Practical information, examples and good practices are also published.

### EUROPE

• SRB published non-confidential information on the resolution of Banco Popular

Extensive <u>non-confidential</u> documents: resolution decision, valuation report (from SRB and independent experts), sale process letter (FROB), and resolution plan for 2016.

• ESRB publishes report on Sovereign Bond-Backed Securities (SBBS)

Includes <u>ESRB's</u> consideration on some key aspects of SBBS, such as the composition of the sovereign bond pool or the tranche structure of the new product.

• EBA launches 2018 EU stress test

Publishes macroeconomic <u>scenarios</u> for the exercise (the most severe scenario to date). Results expected by 2 Nov. ECB to <u>examine</u> 37 euro zone banks.

ESMA publishes results of CCP stress test

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This is the second EU-wide <u>stress test</u> for CCPs. Results show that overall, the system is resilient to the default of multiple clearing members and extreme market shocks.

#### • High-Level Expert Group on sustainable finance releases its final report

Includes key <u>recommendations</u> for embedding <u>sustainability at the core</u> of the EU financial system. Action Plan and findings to be discussed on 22 Mar. BBVA's support <u>link</u>.

• EU Council adopts negotiating directives for the Brexit transition

To give the EU <u>Commission</u> mandate to start the discussions on the transitional period, which is set to last until 31 Dec 2020.

• ESMA updates transitional transparency calculations (TTC)

<u>Modifies</u> previous values published for equity and tick sizes under MiFID II. Additional corrections might be expected in the next two weeks.

• SRB updates documents for the 2018 LDR data collection

<u>It publishes</u>: a liability data report Q&A which reflects feedback to entities, a guidance for the 2018 liability data report and an updated insolvency ranking of each country in the BU.

#### • EIOPA consults RTS on PII and financial capacity of intermediaries

It seeks to <u>adapt</u> the base amounts for Professional Indemnity Insurance and financial capacity of intermediaries under the Insurance Distribution Directive. Deadline: 27 Apr.

#### • EIOPA publishes Market Development Report

It focuses and <u>presents</u> the main findings regarding occupational pensions and cross-border activities for institutions for occupational retirement provisions.

#### • EIOPA updates work programme for 2018

<u>Key objectives</u>: strengthen the protection of consumers, improve the functioning of the internal market and the financial stability of the insurance and occupational pension sectors.

### UNITED STATES



#### · OCC and FED publish Dodd-Frank Act (DFA) stress test scenarios

OCC <u>releases</u> economic and market scenarios for DFA stress test to institutions with more than \$ 10 billion in assets. FED <u>releases</u> scenarios for the CCAR and DFA for the 18 largest and most complex firms, and 20 firms with less complex operations (only quantitative test).

#### • Fed and FDIC complete assessment on 19 foreign banks' resolution plans

Agencies give <u>feedback</u> and expect 19 foreign banks to include several topics in their resolution plans and submit them before 31 Dec 2018. Last submission was in Dec 2015.

#### • CFPB finalizes changes to prepaid accounts rule

Extends <u>effective</u> date of the rule one year, providing more flexibility on credit cards linked to digital wallets. Also adjusts requirements for resolving errors on unregistered accounts.
